
The Blizzard Challenge 2014

Evaluating corpus-based speech synthesis on common databases

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In order to better understand and compare research techniques in building corpus-based speech synthesizers on the same data, the annual Blizzard Challenges 2005-2013 were held. We are now pleased to call for participation in the tenth challenge: Blizzard Challenge 2014. The basic challenge is to take the released speech data, build synthetic voices, and synthesize a prescribed set of test sentences. The output from each synthesizer is then evaluated through extensive listening tests. The following is an outline description of the challenge – for full details and the rules of participation, please see the web pages.

- Indian Languages

- About 2 hours of speech data in each of six Indian languages: Assamese, Gujarati, Hindi, Rajasthani, Tamil and Telugu, recorded by professional speakers in high quality studio environments. Text is provided in UTF-8 format. No other information, such as segment labels, is provided. These speech databases are provided by the group of institutions: IIIT Hyderabad, IIT Madras, DAICT, SSN College of Engineering, IIT Mandi and IIT Guwahati.
- Hub Task 2014-IH1 – Build one voice in each language from the provided data.
- Spoke Task 2014-IH2 – Synthesize multilingual sentences (i. e., IL + English)

Blizzard Workshop: The systems will be presented by the participants at the Blizzard Challenge 2014 workshop, which will be held in Singapore.

A registration fee is payable for each system submitted for evaluation – details can be found on the website.

Licenses: The license for the released data can be found via the Blizzard website. Data will be released to each participant once the appropriate license has been agreed to.
